INTRODUCTION:

The Exploring Youth Sexual Health Needs in Middle Eastern and North African Communities (YSMENA Study) is a CIHR funded study to develop provincial, national, and international collaborations to form Middle East and North Africa Region (MENA) sexual health research network to address gaps in research and services on sexual health needs of MENA youth and encourage collaborations for future research initiatives and knowledge translation and exchange. We were awarded funding to conduct a scoping review of relevant literature and host a single research summit in Toronto, Ontario to bring together participants from diverse disciplines and stakeholder groups.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

The research project coordinator will work under the guidance of the YSMENA Project Research Team, and:

- Reports to Dr. Roula Hawa for all administrative, financial, and human resources issues.
- Reports to the Research Team on project implementation, progress, outcome and evaluation issues.

RESPONSIBILITIES/DUTIES:

Scoping Review:

- Will include peer-reviewed literature and community reports/publications on programs and strategies that focus on:
 - o Youth-specific and youth-driven community empowerment
 - Capacity building
 - Anti-oppression education
 - Gender equity
 - HIV and sexual stigma reduction, and critical dialogue on sex and sexuality and the needs of underrepresented gender and sexual minorities
 - o Gaps in research and services will be identified
 - Will utilize Aksey and O'Malley's framework for conducting a scoping study, which
 consists of 6 stages ranging from identification of the research question to consultation
 by consumers and stakeholders.

Engagement of Stakeholders:

- Engagement of national and international clinicians
- Research partners (post-secondary institutions and other research/policy based bodies)
- MENA youth at risk of HIV and or living with HIV
- Ethno-specific AIDS service organizations
- Community-based organizations (CBOs) serving people living with HIV

- National and international advocacy groups through a research summit in order to inform

- Demonstrated strong writing skills in preparing research reports and translating research findings into lay language and accessible formats for public dissemination

Please submit a proposal no longer than three (3) pages in length, plus at least 3 references outlining how you will fulfill the Responsibilities above and outlining your experience and qualification professionally and personally.
