

St. Lawrence University invites applications for a two-year ASIANetwork-Luce Postdoctoral Teaching Fellowship in Asian Studies with a focus on public health within Southeast and / or Northeast Asia to begin August 15, 2020. This will be a joint appointment in the Asian Studies Program and Public Health Program. Specific areas of scholarly focus are open, but could include maternal-child health, tropical or emerging infectious diseases or environmental health. We are particularly interested in candidates who have good primary field experience in Asia, who take a comparative approach to teaching about public health in the region, and whose scholarly work and teaching integrate an inquiry into Asia's diverse cultural, political, socio-economic, and ecological systems.

The successful candidate will teach three courses per year in their area of expertise, all geared to a broad undergraduate audience consisting of majors and non-majors. A PhD should be received by the time of appointment and no earlier than the last three years. Interested applicants must apply online at <http://employment.stlawu.edu> by uploading the following required materials in the "Applicant Documents" section: a cover letter explaining in detail their interests and plans for teaching and research as well as ideas for creating synergy between Asian Studies and Public Health; a current curriculum vitae; and three recommendation letters. In addition, we require a one-page statement discussing concrete examples of how the applicant's teaching, research, and /or community service could support our campus commitment to diversity and inclusion. Review of applications will begin on March 1, 2020 and continue until the position is filled.
