

August 10, 2017 Dalla Lana School of Public Health Canada Research Chair Tier 2

Applications are invited for a nomination for a Canada Research Chair Tier 2 in one of the Dalla Lana School of Public Health's priority areas (http://www.dlsph.utoronto.ca/initiative/strategic-planning/). This is a key leadership role within the School. Tenure Stream Assistant or Associate Professors employed at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health are eligible. The successful applicant will hold the Chair for a five-year term with the possibility of one renewal. The successful candidate will be expected to supervise graduate students, effectively teach graduate level courses, and actively participate in the School's activities. The CRC funding support formula will be 75% and 25% towards, respectively, salary and research support.

The successful candidate is expected to be a tenure stream Assistant or Associate Professor employed at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health and running a strong research program in one of the School's strategic priority areas and with the potential to become internationally recognized in the coming years. The successful candidate must have an outstanding record of original and innovative research, demonstrated capacity to anchor interdisciplinary and/or collaborative research initiatives, and demonstrated capacity and commitment to leverage external research funding and attract and mentor excellent trainees.

The successful Chair nominee is subject to review and final approval by the CRC secretariat. Applicants must meet eligibility requirements for a CRC Tier 2 position. Tier 2 Chairs are intended for exceptional emerging scholars within 10 years of their highest degree at the time of nomination. Applicants who are more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree may have their eligibility for a Tier 2 Chair assessed through the program's Tier II justification process. Applicants should send a curriculum vitae and a letter of interest that summarizes their accomplishments, including a statement on their strengths and experience in increasing diversity. The submitted applications will be reviewed by the Search Committee. The successful candidate will be asked to submit a full CRC nomination submission to the U of T Research Services Office by September 22 for editorial, administrative and budget feedback; and the full final nomination submission via MRA by October 16, 2017.
