¹ Important note to Non-Canadian Visiting Professor regarding the Work Permit

In order to facilitate your entry to Canada, you have to contact the nearest Visa Post <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/offices/apply-where.asp> (an office that processes immigration applications in a Canadian Embassy, Consulate, or High Commission located outside of Canada) to obtain the necessary documents - including a **Work Permit** and, if necessary, a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) applicable to certain countries whose citizens require a visa to travel to Canada (<http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>) and/or a medical examination. If a Temporary Resident Visa is not required, you can apply for a work permit at a Port of Entry (a Citizenship and Immigration Canada office located at a border crossing, airport or seaport in Canada). In addition, you will need a letter from your home institution attesting to the fact that you will be retaining your position there to resume your duties after the end of your appointment at the DLSPH. That letter and the letter of offer must be presented to an immigration officer in a Visa Post (or a Port of Entry as outlined above). A Work Permit will then be processed pursuant to *Regulation 205(b)*, Labour Market Opinion Exemption Code C22. The processing fee for a work permit is currently \$155 (Cdn). Please also note that you are required to be in possession of a valid passport and it will be necessary for the passport to be valid for the entire length of their stay in Canada.
