Dr. Howard K. Koh, MD, MPH | Harvey V. Fineberg Professor of Practice of Public Health Leadership, Health Policy and Management, Harvard University

Dr. Howard Koh served as the Assistant Secretary for Health for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (2009-2014) under President Barack Obama, and as Commissioner of Public Health for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (1997-2003). A graduate of Yale College and the Yale University School of Medicine, he's earned board certifications in four medical fields, published more than 300 articles and has received over 70 awards, including six honorary doctorate degrees.
