The **Connaught Global Challenge Award** aims to heighten U of T's contribution to important issues facing society through the advancement of knowledge, and the transfer and application of solutions. \$1 million annually will be awarded to support approximately 4 team initiatives of up to \$250K each.

Furthermore, the **Connaught Global Research Impact Program (C-GRIP)**, provides additional funding for Global Challenge teams who wish to partner internationally to achieve the goals of the Connaught Global Challenge.

Funds of up to \$10,000 can be used to support successful applicants to seed a new Collaborative Research Team with the aim of applying for a DSI [Catalyst Grant](#). Applicants will present their research and methodology/theory at a seminar, including its potential for applied fields.

International Policy Ideas Challenge 2022

Call for proposals

Global Affairs Canada (GAC), in collaboration with the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC), is pleased to announce the sixth edition of the International Policy Ideas Challenge. The program offers applicants a chance to test their skills at translating academic expertise into policy language and insights. Winners will present their briefs to Government of Canada officials as part of the virtual Ideas Symposium, which GAC will host in late 2022.

Up to 6 awards will be granted. For each winning proposal, \$3,000 will be provided to the lead (or sole) researcher upon submission of the final brief and formal presentation to GAC. Additionally, all winners will receive mandatory coaching from the Balsillie School of International Affairs (BSIA) (4 coaching sessions during the summer and fall of 2022).

International Doctoral Cluster (IDC)

Call for applications

U of T is calling for applications to the International Doctoral Clusters (IDC) Program. An IDC is a partnership between U of T faculty and trainees and international partner institutions (academic/corporate/NGO etc.) that brings together, through in-

person and virtual activities, a critical mass of complementary talent (PIs, PDFs, and graduate students).

The Office of the Vice-President International (OVPI) and the School of Graduate Studies (SGS) will provide one third of the budget, up to a maximum of \$33,000 CAD/year for the associated travel costs for U of T students, PDFs, and faculty, for up to 3 years initially, subject to internal review. PIs should secure the remaining 2/3rd from within and beyond the University.

Deadlines

Application Deadline: Four annual competitions; May 15th, September 15th, December 15th, and February 15th.
Notification to successful applicants will occur within 8 weeks of submission.

Data Science for Public Health and Health Systems 2022-2023 DLSPH Graduate Awards

The [Interdisciplinary Research Cluster on Data Science for Population Health and Health Systems](#) is one of the five priority research areas at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health (DLSPH), which responds to the importance of advancing data sciences, artificial intelligence and emerging technologies in informatics and analytics to improve population health and health systems performance.

The DLSPH Data Science Interdisciplinary Research Cluster is offering \$10,000 (for 1 year; April 25, 2022 – April 24, 2023) stipends to support up to FOUR DLSPH graduate trainees (MSc, PhD, DrPH), registered as a full-time DLSPH trainee in a thesis-based program, conducting novel research and/or developing new methods in data science and artificial intelligence to improve population health and health system performance.

NSERC and SSHRC Grants: Unfunded Extensions Due to continued COVID-19 Impact

For those faculty members who hold an eligible NSERC or SSHRC grant, we wanted to share with you that for the remainder of 2022, both Agencies will continue to provide an additional unfunded 12-month extension due to any continuing delays in research activity because of COVID-19, upon request. You are eligible to request such an extension if:

1. Your grant is in its final year, AND
2. Is one of the grant types listed in the table under “Grant types eligible for extension”

How to obtain an extension

NSERC and SSHRC have authorized institutions to provide the unfunded extension. Write to your [RSO or IPO](#) contact to request the extension, citing delays due to COVID-19.
