SSHRC Partnership Engage Grants

Residential Schools Joint Initiative

SSHRC is partnering with the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, as part of the response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action, to offer a unique opportunity for short-term funding to support Indigenous community-led research and related activities involving community decision-making processes, research, and actions regarding residential school sites in Canada.

This NCTR-SSHRC joint initiative is in the form of a one-time funding opportunity, the Partnership Engage Grants—Residential Schools Joint Initiative (PEG RSJI). SSHRC is committed to invest up to \$1M over the June 2022 PEG competition to support residential schools related projects. PEG RSJI grants are valued at a maximum amount of \$50,000 per project for a duration of one year.

Please note, regular SSHRC PEG applications may also be submitted in this round, with the usual maximum budget of \$25,000. Details are available on the <u>SSHRC PEG</u> <u>webpage</u>.

The DSI Catalyst Grant is a competitive seed funding program, offering \$100,000 over 1-2 years, for multidisciplinary teams forming a Collaborative Research Team (CRT).

The Manchester-Melbourne-Toronto (MMT) Research Fund

The University of Manchester, the University of Melbourne, and the University of Toronto are contributing matching funds to support collaborative bilateral and trilateral research initiatives through a joint call for proposals. The overall aim of the Manchester-Melbourne-Toronto (MMT) Research Fund is to encourage and provide initial support for the development of high-quality research activities that include Early Career Researchers.

Funding: Up to approximately \$22,000 CAD for bilateral and approximately \$33,000 CAD for trilateral

Duration: 18 months, beginning October 2022

Each application will be assessed by a joint committee of members from all three institutions.

Robbins-Ollivier Award for Excellence in Equity

Call for Nominations

The Division of the Vice-President, Research and Innovation invites internal nominations for the inaugural Robbins-Ollivier Award for Excellence in Equity, which has been launched by the Canada Research Chairs Program to fund bold and potentially game-changing projects that will take action to address persistent systemic barriers in the research ecosystem and academia. Three Awards, each valued at \$100,000 over one year, will be presented annually to eligible faculty members or teams of faculty members nominated by Canadian institutions.

The University of Toronto may submit only **one nomination** for this competition per year. Internal nominators are encouraged to review the <u>selection criteria</u> carefully and ensure nominated projects meet the criteria robustly.

Deadlines: To nominate a faculty member or team for consideration by the committee, complete the following steps:

- Submit an online Expression of Interest by April 29, 2022.
- Submit components a) and b) of the Robbins-Ollivier Award <u>Nomination Package</u> in a single PDF document to <u>vpri.awards@utoronto.ca</u> by May 20, 2022.

2023 SSHRC Impact Awards: Call for Internal Nominations

The Office of the Vice-President, Research and Innovation invites internal nominations for the 2023 <u>Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) Impact Awards</u> for faculty, which recognize outstanding researchers and celebrate their research achievements, research training, knowledge mobilization, and outreach activities funded partially or entirely by SSHRC.

Internal nominations are now open for the following four awards:

Gold Medal for sustained leadership, dedication and originality of thought (\$100,000); Insight Award for outstanding achievement arising from a research project funded partially or completely by SSHRC (\$50,000);

<u>Connection Award</u> for an outstanding SSHRC-funded initiative to facilitate the flow and exchange of research knowledge within and/or beyond the academic community (\$50.000):

<u>Partnership Award</u> recognizing a SSHRC-funded formal partnership for its outstanding achievement in advancing research, research training, or knowledge mobilization (\$50,000).

New Canada Gairdner Awards for Mid- and Early-Career Investigators

The <u>Canada Gairdner Momentum Award</u> (\$50,000) will annually recognize two midcareer investigators, typically 10-15 years past their first independent research appointment, working in Canada who in their last 6 active years have produced exceptional scientific research contributions with continued potential for impact on human health.
