The <u>Data Sciences Institute</u> <u>Seed Funding for Methodologists</u> initiative is designed to encourage new collaborations of data science methodologists and theorists with applied researchers. Our goal ensures new collaborative research teams (CRTs) are forged with new and unexpected connections, thus fostering cutting-edge data science work by presenting and bringing to the fore innovative methodological and theoretical work. Single applicants working in data sciences methodology or theory can apply for this grant. An applicant's research area must focus on data sciences methodology or theory with the potential to be relevant to applied fields. Applicants will present their research and methodology/theory at a seminar, including its potential for applied fields.

Funds of up to \$10,000 can be used to support successful applicants to seed a new CRT with the aim of applying for a DSI <u>Catalyst Grant</u>.

University of Toronto's Novo Nordisk Network for Healthy Population 2022 Catalyst Grant Competition

The Novo Nordisk Network for Healthy Populations is committed to supporting multi-disciplinary, collaborative teams to co-design initiatives and interventions in the Peel Region focused on reducing the burden of diabetes and chronic disease. Catalyst grants will be awarded to support evidence-informed programs, interventions, approaches, or evaluations that have shown promise in other contexts and align to the Network's mission: To reduce social inequities in risk and burden of diabetes and other chronic diseases through better care, lower risk factors and healthier living environments.

A maximum award of \$75,000 per year, up to 2 years, will be available for each successful grant.
