Letters from two references. You are responsible for speaking to your references BEFORE submitting your application. As soon as you submit your application, an automated email request will be sent to the people you put down as references. The email will ask them to upload a reference for you using a unique link. Please be sure to notify your references that a request will come from Public Health Policy as the sender. The letters of reference should describe the student's academic ability and career aspirations and comment on the student's

potential benefit from the Collaborative Program.
