**About us:**

The Dalla Lana School of Public Health is a Faculty of the University of Toronto that originated as one of the Schools of Hygiene begun by the Rockefeller Foundation in 1927. The School went through a dramatic renaissance after the 2003 SARS crisis and it is now the largest public health school in Canada, with more than 850 faculty, 1,000 students, and research and training partnerships with institutions throughout Toronto and the world. With \$40.4 million in research funding per year, the School supports discovery in global health, tobacco impacts on health, occupational disease and disability, air pollution, inner city and Indigenous health, among many other areas.

**Your Opportunity:**

The DrPH is Canada's first doctoral training program in advanced public health and health systems practice. The DrPH is an advanced public health professional degree that prepares and trains mid-career professionals to pursue senior leadership positions in public health and health systems. Using a combination of applied and course-based approaches, students will develop critical skills that are needed for solving emerging and complex health and health system problems. This is a unique doctoral offering that is aligned with the DLSPH Academic Plan 2019-2024.

As a part-time faculty dedicated to the DrPH program, you will work closely with the DrPH Program Director to support the implementation of the DrPH program, including mentorship and support for Mastercard Foundation (MCF) funded scholars, and to work with other faculty and key local/global stakeholders to ensure the success and impact of DrPH program. You will be an established public health/health systems researcher and educator with demonstrated experience within academia and linkages to policy and practice settings globally. We seek candidates who value diversity and whose research, teaching and service bear out our School's commitment to equity. In their cover letter, applicants are asked to comment on how they practice diversity and equity as a public health researcher and educator.

**Your Responsibilities will include to:**

- Contribute to teaching in the DrPH program, as needed
- Optimize the integration of the MCF funded Scholars into the DLSPH community through dedicated mentorship and other forms of support
- Support MCF scholars in securing an Applied Research Project in accordance with program requirements and support and monitor their implementation
- Work with faculty to support the delivery of existing and emerging courses for the DrPH program in line with principles of decolonizing pedagogy



**Essential Qualifications:**

- Candidates must have doctoral training in a related health field **or** a combination of a health professional degree and graduate level training.
- A demonstrated commitment to applied research and teaching in the field of public health, health systems and related fields is required.
- Demonstrated experience pertaining to course development, instruction, and supervision and mentorship of students for applied research projects.
- Demonstrated experience teaching in graduate level programs with relevance to public health.
- Proven relationship building experience, with established networks within local, national and global public health/health systems.
- Demonstrated understanding of key public health graduate education standards, competencies and training requirements in Canada is an asset.
- Relevant publication record, including articles in the fields relevant to the DrPH program.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
