Stella's passion was sparked by the challenges she experienced as a pediatric audiologist in the public school system, which motivated her to launch her research program in reflective practice, critical reflection, and critical pedagogies. She mobilizes this

research within her extensive education and leadership work, which has been recognized with a Minister's Award of Excellence, a Ministry Early Researcher Award, and a Meridith Marks New Educator Award. Stella is currently the Director of the Centre for Advancing Collaborative Healthcare & Education, a Scientist at the Wilson Centre and The Institute for Education Research, and an Associate Professor at the University of Toronto.

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
