- The network grant has been funded to allow us (entire team, and specific projects) to address Indigenous mental health through Indigenous knowledges
- How? We all have all our specific projects, with specific areas of interest. We will create an evaluation tool of specific impacts of our communities
- Mechanics of what everyone role will be
- Working with provincial mentorship networks- Chantel (lead for Ontario)
- Plan to have national, and international reach (B.C, Alberta, Manitoba) (Hawaii, Australia)
- Most of the work will be done within Ontario, then link it to the national and international
 - b. Budget
- Something that we're still working on...
- \$700,000 for 5 years
- Large portion is to support Indigenous mentorship for students
- Chantel, Janet, Suzanne leading the Indigenous mentorship. \$100,000
- 2022 funding will be re-visited
- \$300,000 is for student training (salaries distributed throughout the entire NEIHR project, can be distributed throughout the network), \$100,000 admin, \$120,000 paying the salary of non-academic staff, \$80,000 for events, remainder (divided evenly for specific research for each researcher on existing projects or create new projects)
- Added benefit of keeping Elders
- Expanding leadership team (outside of Ontario)??? Right now its only 4 people... Email Suzanne if you want to be a part of that leadership

- Concern (Rod), Implications of supporting students in such a big way... Janet response: Chantelle made an amazing network in Ontario, represents almost every institution in Ontario. We should focus on Elders and Knowledge Keepers that are located in community, so they can mentor the students (intergenerational knowledge transmission).
- Lynn (overall project)- Principles related to how we function as a collective group. Projects this large can have a lot of moving parts. How does communication happen within the group????- Response: Suzanne creation of sub themes to guide this knowledge
- What are some of the models that have worked? And is based within cultural ways of doing? (Send email to Suzanne) Leadership accountability
- Question about student's research opportunities??- Students will have opportunities during annual gathering. Masters students (extended period of times). The ability to create research opportunities that are across international lines. This kind of collaboration can benefit international knowledge (Australia, Canada and Hawaii Indigenous knowledges).
