The MPH Indigenous Health Program seeks 1 Course Instructor for the following course:

Course Number & Title: CHL5525H - Indigenous Social Determinants of Health in Canada - .5FCE

Course Description: This course introduces students to the social determinants of health faced by Indigenous peoples. Indigenous peoples are First Nations, Metis and Inuit individuals, families, communities, and nations. The course takes place over a week and includes seminar discussions and lectures. Students will be provided with scenarios and real-world examples of issues that impact the health and well-being of Indigenous peoples.

Minimum Qualifications: PhD in relevant social and behavioural sciences and detailed knowledge of Indigenous social determinants of health in Canada.

Relevant Criterion:

Past teaching experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position

Description of duties: As well as normal teaching duties, the instructor will plan lectures and other learning activities; plan and evaluate student assignments; mentor students and support learning, and communicate with the PhD program director as necessary. This is a land-based course taught at the Mother Earth Learning lodge (not classroom) on St. George campus.
